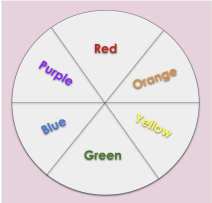

Compare and contrast the artistic elements of color, contract, and composition in your salmon and voice pictographs. How are they alike? How are they different? Below is some information to help you start thinking. Use information from the Color, Contrast & Composition lesson to help you think of more ideas. Copy the Venn Diagram below in your journal and record your thinking.

Color	 Red and green are <u>complementary colors</u> because they are on opposite sides of the wheel. Blue and orange are <u>complementary colors</u> because they are on opposite sides of the wheel. Yellow and purple are <u>complementary colors</u> because they are on opposite sides of the wheel.
Contrast	 Orange and yellow are not complementary and they have a lower contrast Yellow and purple are complementary, and they have a higher contrast Orange & purple are not complementary, but they have a higher contrast Using <u>contrast</u> can make our artwork stand out, especially when we are creating something that may be looked at from a distance. <u>Contrast</u> in art refers to difference. <u>Contrast</u> in art can be created by combining elements that are very different from one another.
Composition	<u>Composition</u> is about putting everything together. <u>Composition</u> in art refers to the way we arrange the different elements and subjects within the space that we are creating a work of art.

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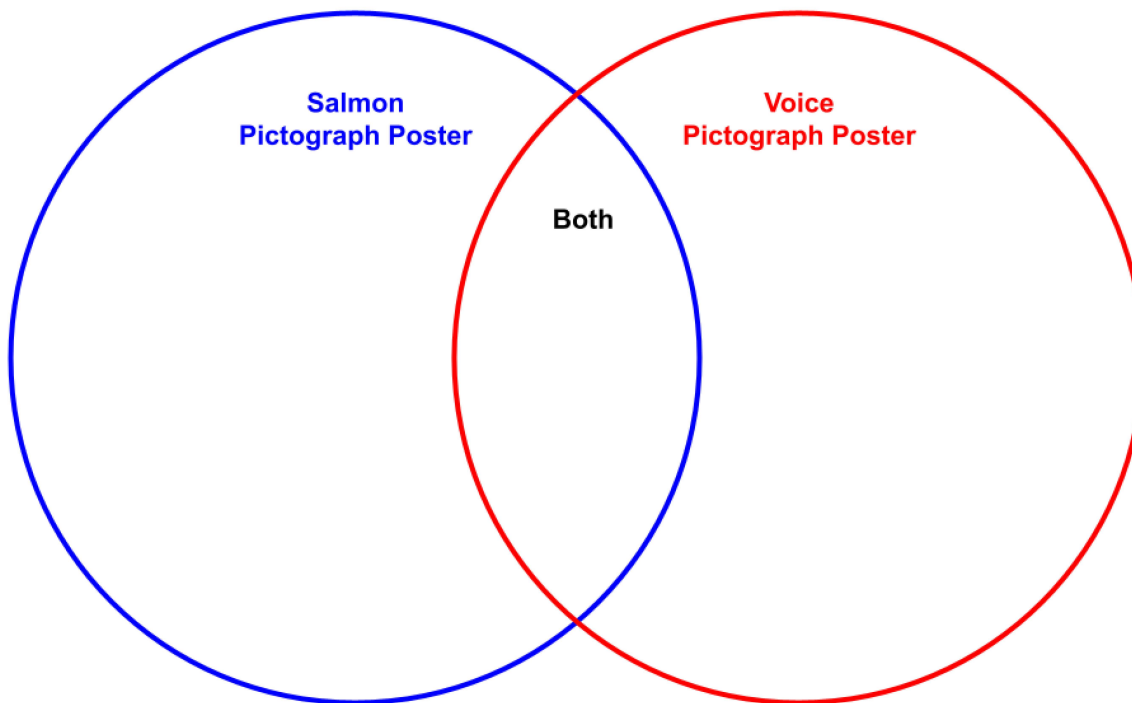
